

Pioneers begin quest for NAIA World Series as No. 2 seed in Marion, Ind., Opening Rd Bracket

PITTSBURGH (May 6, 2012) — The Point Park University baseball team received an at-large bid to the NAIA Baseball National Championship Opening Round and will be a No. 2 seed in the Marion, Ind., Bracket from May 10-14. The Pioneers, ranked No. 12 in the Final NAIA Baseball Coaches' Top 25 Poll (May 6), are one of 45 teams in the NAIA Opening Rd, the regional stage of the national tournament prior to the NAIA World Series. The NAIA Opening Round includes nine, five-team tournaments at campus sites around the country. The nine winners of those brackets will join host Lewis-Clark State in the NAIA World Series May 25-June 1.

Point Park (48-9, 11-0 AMC) begins play in the national tournament on May 10 at 4 p.m. ET vs. NAIA No. 24 Taylor (Ind.) (37-18), the No. 3 seed in the Marion, Ind., bracket. The Pioneers' bracket also includes NAIA No. 9 and defending World Series champion Concordia (Calif.) (37-16) as the top seed. The five-team bracket gets started with No. 4 seed Mt. Vernon Nazarene (Ohio) (33-18) vs. No. 5 seed Doane (Neb.) (33-19) on May 10 at 12 p.m. ET. The winner of that game gets Concordia at 8 ET.

Play continues in Marion, Ind., until a champion is crowned, which could come as soon as May 12. If necessary, a second championship-round game will be on May 14 with a time TBA. A minimum of three wins through the winner's bracket stand between Point Park and its 11th trip to the NAIA World Series. Four or five wins are needed through loser's bracket.

Point Park Pioneers in the NAIA World Series — '74, '78, '79, '80, '86, '87, '88, '89, '91, '98

The Pioneers rank fifth all-time with 10 appearances in the NAIA World Series. But they have not been back to the promised land of NAIA baseball since 1998. Before that, Point Park set a torrid pace of reaching the NAIA World Series 10 times in the 25 years from 1974-98. Point Park's tradition of success includes an all-time record of 1,153-626-9 entering the national tournament. Point Park's best finishes in the NAIA World Series include placing third at the 1979 and 1986 tournaments.

Point Park University Baseball 2012 Team Notes

The 2012 edition of the Point Park Pioneers baseball team had a lot of makings for success coming off of last year's record of 38-13 and No. 23 ranking in the Final NAIA Top 25 Poll. Last year marked a step toward reclaiming Point Park's tradition of excellence in NAIA baseball even though it ended with the Pioneers being the first team left of the at-large bids to the Opening Rd.

The Pioneers returned three of four starting pitchers from last year's squad, and pitching has been the foundation for the 2012 season. Point Park ranks seventh in the NAIA in team ERA at 3.00 entering the tournament and each of its top five starters has an ERA under 2.55. Not only did the Pioneers return starting pitchers Derek Peluso (8-1), Sean Clark (6-0) and Ryan Loutsenhizer (5-0) from 2011, it also bolstered its staff with the additions of freshman Nate Spohn (8-0) and transfers Manny Perdomo (7-0) and Horacio Acosta (3-0). Also, senior closer Mike Tullio is back for his third year and is among the NAIA leaders with 13 saves this year.

Point Park returned only 3 of 9 hitters from last year's lineup but has successfully plugged those holes with a mix of transfers who have stepped in to help right away and backups turned starters this year. Lee Bodnar (3B), Dillon Sauers (SS) and Tom Pasinski (CF) all started last year. Tom Birko (2B) is back after shoulder surgery kept him out in 2011, and Rob Novia (LF) and Steve Dujka (1B) are full-time starters for the first time. Ossie Alfonzo (C) and Marlon Leyva (DH) transferred this year. Don McDuffee (RF) has started for injured Javy Marticorena (RF) since April.

Point Park had been ranked in the Top 10 in every regular season poll prior to being No. 12 in the Final Poll on May 6. The Pioneers debuted at No. 9 in the first-regular season poll (March 24) after being No. 26 in the preseason. Point Park got as high as No. 8 on April 3 at 28-3.



#1 Concordia University Eagles (Irvine, Calif.) • NAIA Rank: No. 9 • 37-16 overall, 22-10 GSAC

Summary — The Eagles are the defending NAIA World Series champions, and they went from unranked to the 2011 title. They were preseason No. 2 in the NAIA rankings this year, and enter the national tournament ranked No. 9 in the country at 37-16 overall. Concordia won the Golden State Athletic Conference Tournament title to qualify for NAIAs. The Eagles knocked off NAIA No. 4 Azusa Pacific on the way to the title. Concordia is in the national tournament for the fifth time (2006, 2009-12) and has reached two NAIA World Series. From last year's team, the Eagles lost an All-American DH/1B, a World Series MVP outfielder, a starting catcher and a starting pitcher. NAIA All-American Bryan Nicholson (1B/DH) was drafted by the Giants, and starting catcher John Hill (C) was drafted by the Phillies.

Key Stats — The Eagles hit .321 as a team and rank highly in the NAIA in triples and stolen bases with good team speed. The Eagles average 2.4 stolen bases per game. Concordia averages 7.2 runs per game and slugs .467 as a team. The team ERA is 4.58, and opponents hit .293 off of Eagles pitching.

Both MCC teams were put in the Marion, Ind., bracket as part of the MCC winning an Opening Rd. host bid.
