POINT PARK VOLLEYBALL 2009 SEASON PROSPECTUS

Pioneers picked to finish eighth in AMC

PITTSBURGH – The Point Park University volleyball team was picked to finish eighth in the American Mideast Conference in the 2009 NAIA Volleyball Conference Ratings preseason poll, which was released by the NAIA on Aug. 17.

After losing six seniors to graduation, the Pioneers are picked to finish in the same spot they found themselves in the conference standings at the end of last season. Point Park was 19-18 overall and 7-7 in the AMC in 2008 to finish in eighth place and one game out of the league playoffs.

Last year's regular season champion Walsh (29-13 overall, 13-1 AMC) was picked to finish first while AMC tournament champion Shawnee State (38-3, 12-2) was chosen second. The AMC has 13 teams, which is two less than last year. Ohio Dominican (23-11, 11-3) and Rio Grande (7-24, 0-14) are no longer AMC members.

Although the Pioneers are picked to finish in the bottom half of the league, that it probably due to the graduation of six players who helped turn the program around more so than anything. Gone are 2007 AMC North Player of the Year **Erin Sneider** as well as 2007 AMC North Setter of the Year **Kala Schnur**. Point Park also graduated **Heather Pegg** and **Ashley Santavy**, who each earned All-AMC North honors multiple times.

When those players were freshmen in 2005, first-year coach **Mike Bruno** inherited a team that had gone 0-18 in AMC play for three straight seasons. But Bruno, now in his fifth year, has led the Pioneers to a 72-74 record the last four seasons. Point Park made the AMC playoffs in 2006 and 2007 before falling one game shy last year.

And as the Pioneers try to put together their third straight winning season -- something that has never been done in school history – the cupboard is hardly bare of talent for the 2009 edition of Point Park volleyball.

Tri-captains **Megan Lamens** (New Baltimore/Berlin Bros.), **Rachel Roddy** (Greensburg/Greensburg Salem) and **Ashley Zietak** (Pittsburgh/Brashear) provide veteran leadership, and they are joined by sophomore setter **Katie Geary** (Pittsburgh/Shaler) in giving Point Park four returning starters.

Lamens is the lone senior, and she teams with Zietak, a junior, in solidifying the front line as a pair of 6-0 middle hitters. Zietak was an All-AMC third team selection last year, one season after being named the AMC North Freshman of the Year. Lamens, who is in her second season at Point Park since transferring from NCAA Divison III power Juniata, was an All-AMC honorable mention choice.

Roddy, a junior outside hitter, is in her second year as captain and is the Pioneers' leader on the floor. Roddy has an all-round game that has allowed her to rack up 931 digs and 744 kills her first two years. She had career highs of 538 digs and 414 as a freshman. At the end of the volleyball season, she will join the women's basketball team.

Geary split time with Schnur at setter in her freshman season, but is ready to build on the 559 assists that she recorded last season. Other returning letter winners include **Zoe Hughes** (Butler/Knoch), who had 184 digs and 152 kills, **Jen Poland** (Pittsburgh/Fox Chapel), who had 101 digs and **Cassandra Maxwell** (Burgettstown/Burgettstown), who saw action in 20 matches.

Among the key newcomers, Bruno has added three all-state players to his roster. With the addition of outside hitters **Ali Gendron** (Sheffield, Ohio/Brookside) and **Lindsey Oberacker** (Erie/McDowell) and right-side hitter **Kirsten Burkes** (Robinson/Montour), the Pioneers now have five all-state players on their team. Roddy and Hughes were each named all-state during their high school careers.

Bruno is in his 10th year as a head coach on the college level. Prior to Point Park, he spent five years at Waynesburg and amassed a record of 116-58. He enters the 2009 season 12 wins shy of 200 in his career (188-132).

TOP RETURNING PLAYERS

ASHLEY ZIETAK (MH, 6-0, Jr., Pittsburgh/Brashear): A two-time All-AMC performer, Zietak has emerged as one of the top middle hitters in the conference. She was an All-AMC third-team choice last year after ranking among the league leaders in hitting (.328), aces (65) and blocks (79). Her 345 kills were second on the team. She was the AMC North Freshman of the Year and a first-team All-AMC North selection as a freshman in 2007.

RACHEL RODDY (OH/OPP, 5-9, Jr., Greensburg/Greensburg Salem): Roddy has been among the team leaders in kills and digs the last two years, and she is the Pioneers' best all-around player. She led the team with 393 digs last year and tallied 330 kills. Roddy was a member of the All-AMC North Freshmen team in 2007 when she posted career highs of 538 digs and 414 kills. Roddy will join the women's basketball team at season's end.

MEGAN LAMENS (MH, 6-0, Sr., New Baltimore/Berlin Bros. Valley): The lone senior on the team, Lamens is in her second season with the Pioneers since transferring from NCAA Division III power Juniata. Lamens led the team in kills with 403 and was 10th in the AMC in kills per game (3.1). Lamens, who was an All-AMC honorable mention choice, joins Zietak and Roddy as a team captain.

KATIE GEARY (**S, 5-9, So., Pittsburgh/Shaler**): Geary was one of two setters in the rotation last year and she handed out 559 assists as a freshman. She had eight matches with 20 or more assists, and the 5-9 Geary was third on the team with 30 blocks. Geary is one of four returning starters, and she was the only freshman to play in all 37 matches.

ZOE HUGHES (OH, 5-9, So., Butler/Knoch): Hughes had a solid freshman season after placing fifth on the team in kills (152) and fourth on the team in digs (184). She played in 32 matches and 98 games, and is one of three returning players who posted 100 or more digs. As a member of the Point Park softball team, Hughes batted .354 and was an All-AMC honorable mention selection last year

TOP NEWCOMERS

KIRSTEN BURKES (OPP., 6-0, Fr., Robinson/Montour): As a senior at Montour, Burkes earned a spot on the PVCA Class AA all-state team in 2008. She was a two-time WPIAL Class AA first-team selection.

ALI GENDRON (OH, 5-9, Fr., Sheffield, Ohio/Brookside): As a senior at Brookside, Gendron was named All-Ohio Division II third team and was the Player of the Year in the Patriot Athletic Conference and Lorain County (Division II).

LINDSEY OBERACKER (OH, 5-11, Fr., Erie/McDowell): As a senior at McDowell, Oberacker was named PVCA Class AAA all-state and the Region 6 Player of the Year. Oberacker also earned all-region and all-district honors.

HEAD COACH MIKE BRUNO (Robert Morris '90)

Bruno is in his fifth year as head coach at Point Park, and with a record of 72-74, he is the volleyball program's all-time leader in victories. He is the longest-tenured coach in the history of the program, which was started in 1991. In 10 years as a head coach, Bruno has a career record of 188-132. He was 116-58 in five years at Waynesburg (2000-04). He has been named Coach of the Year on four occasions, including 2006 when he was the AMC North Coach of the Year. He was named Coach of the Year in the President's Athletic Conference in 2000, 2003 and 2004.

Otherwise, the top eight places include the same teams with a slightly different order.

After Walsh and Shawnee State, the top 10 is rounded out by Mount Vernon Nazarene (36-11, 10-4), Cedarville (27-12, 10-4), Malone (24-15, 9-5), Notre Dame (19-13, 6-8), Northwestern Ohio (26-11, 9-5), **Point Park** (19-18, 7-7), Daemen (12-23, 6-8) and Roberts Wesleyan (17-19, 6-8). Teams that were not rated were Ursuline (12-21, 3-11), Houghton (12-18, 2-12) and Carlow (7-22, 1-13).
