

## GARDENS AND GREENSPACE



- 1932 WPC is founded under original name, Greater Pittsburgh Parks Association
- 1998 Duquesne Light and The Pittsburgh Project partner with WPC to plant "The Welcome Garden." More than 30,000 flowers are planted by the entrance to the Fort Pitt tunnel
- 1999 WPC and Pittsburgh Downtown Partnership plant 246 hanging baskets in downtown Pittsburgh

200,000 flowers have
been planted by more
than 12,500 volunteers
across 20 counties






