PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

Upon successful completion of this program, a student will be able to:

1. Offer clear and concise oral and written intelligence reports based on the formats, content, and style of declassified reports from the intelligence community.
2. Apply critical thinking in order to collect, analyze, and interpret information by using accepted methods from the intelligence community. This includes the use of link chart analysis software and other methods and tools of the intelligence community.
3. Define domestic and international terrorism and describe and analyze terrorist organizations, their structures, motivations, methods, financing, and global effect on international policies.
4. Describe, evaluate, and analyze the history of U.S. Intelligence, its evolution in the U.S., and its effect on national policies.
5. List, describe, and evaluate a range of intelligence tradecraft techniques and the sources and methods of the "dark arts." Students will also assess the most effective application of various tradecraft techniques to attain specific intelligence goals.
