- 5.** Identify and communicate (in oral and written form) the characteristics and distinctions of historically significant cinematic works and artists.
- 6.** Think analytically and critically about visual media from a technical, aesthetic and narrative perspective.

SECOND-YEAR PORTFOLIO REVIEW

Near the beginning of the second-year spring semester all BFA Cinema Arts students are required to submit a portfolio application. A committee that consists of full-time faculty from the program will review to determine if and/or how each student will continue on in the Cinema Arts department. Students will be notified about the decision of their application from the committee by the end of that spring semester.
