PROCEDURES (Introduction, Body, Closing):

Introduction:

- 1. Grab the students' attention by:
- Reviewing material
- Sharing a story

- Asking thought-provoking questions
- Sharing a visual
- Writing one word on the board
- Acting out an idea
- Reading a poem
- Telling a joke/using humor
- 2. Explain the lesson's objectives and the agenda (Tell What & Why of the Lesson)

Body: (I DO, WE DO, YOU DO)

- 1. Elicit discussion
- Ask questions
- Facilitate dialogue between students
- 2. Explain Activity
- 3. Model Procedures
- 4. Provide Guided Practice
- 5. Allow Independent Practice
- 6. Assess student understanding

Closing:

- 1. Summarize lesson objectives
- 2. Closing possibilities
- Relate to intro
- Explain next-steps
- Ask a "think about" question

ADAPTATIONS & ACCOMMODATIONS (Specific and General):

Determine the individual needs of students in class based on their Individual Education Plans or other information that is available. Decide what types of teaching, learning and curricular modifications are necessary to ensure that students are able to achieve academic success. ASSESSMENT (Formative and/or Summative):

Assess and evaluate students' understanding of the content informally and formally. Be observant as you teach. How will you know that the students learned what you taught? How will you provide feedback to students on their level of achievement? What rubrics will you use to measure student success?

ASSIGNMENT:

What will the students be required to complete or accomplish to determine the extent of their learning. Consider differentiating the assignment so that students of higher, average and lower ability levels can effectively complete the assignment and demonstrate success at their own level.
