

In a 3 day lab, we'll teach you how to recognize the structures of features, repair a plaster skull with materials on hand, and restore trauma on one of our Headzo heads.

Our Headzos were designed by a special effects artist to mimic real cases our students have encountered.

You'll lay the foundation for the skills to allow a mother to spend one more moment with her son who died in a car accident, or give a grieving family a final image of their matriarch without the cancer that made her unrecognizable.

You will have the ability to change the lives of the survivors, to put them on a healthier road to recovery from grief.

Standard pace students meet 2 consecutive days a week for 2 years. Accelerated pace students meet 3 consecutive days a week for 1 year.

FAFSA / Federal Student Aid

ALWAYS ENSURE THAT YOU ARE ON A .gov SITE TO
AVOID SCAMS!!

We recommend completing a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) by May 1st each year regardless of how you plan to pay!

For PA residents: It also serves as your application for state grants!

Pell Grants are eligibility-based (household income, number of people in household, number in college, etc.) and do not need to be paid back.

There is a lifetime limit for how much you can borrow, so take into account any outstanding Federal Direct Student Loans you already have! Borrowing limits and eligibility are based on dependent or independent status.

Consort / Capstone

Some schools pay us directly, some do it another way. Pop into their financial aid office and see the best way to handle tuition!

Veterans Affairs Benefits

Have you (or your spouse/parents) served in the Armed Forces for more than two years and receive Veterans Affairs (VA) Benefits?

Notify the VA through their website and let them know you're planning to attend PIMS. They will send you a letter notifying you of approval.

Provide us with a copy!

Scholarships / Grants

We recommend applying to as many scholarships as you can!

Any scholarship money received is money you don't have to pay back!

Employer Reimbursement

SUBMIT THE FOLLOWING ONE-AT-A-TIME OR ALL TOGETHER...

Admissions Health Screening Form: All information must be on the medical form. No supplemental medical documentation of immunizations will be accepted.
Headshot-style photo ID: Please be professional, no filters or copies of IDs.
High School Transcript or Equivalency: If a final high school GPA is 2.3 or less, 12 liberal arts or general education college credits with a cumulative GPA of 2.3 or higher will be required.
All Official College Transcripts (if applicable): Send all official transcripts directly to PIMS from the institution or via approved electronic transcript service. If sent by applicant, they are no longer "official" and won't be accepted.
Health Insurance Card: a photocopy or photo is fine.
 IF SEEKING A LICENSE IN PENNSYLVANIA: COMPLETE THE CERTIFICATE OF PRELIMINARY EDUCATION (COPE) PROCESS If seeking a license in Pennsylvania, you are required to submit a Certificate of Preliminary Education (COPE) if you have at least 60 credits prior to starting PIMS. Online Students: Must have a Certificate of Preliminary Education (COPE) completed to be considered for acceptance.
Campus Students: Can start class without a Certificate of Preliminary Education (COPE) but will be scheduled for the 97 credit program until the Certificate is completed and provided to admissions.
