

FINANCIAL AID MADE SIMPLE

Don't assume you are not eligible for financial aid. All types of aid are not based solely on financial need.

STEP

1

Apply for admission at PointPark.edu/Apply
(no application fee)

All students admitted are automatically considered for merit-based scholarships.

STEP

2

Understand the FAFSA at PointPark.edu/FAFSA

Federal grant and loan awards are determined by the Free Application for Federal Student Aid; nearly all colleges use it as the basis for awarding financial aid.

STEP

3

Complete the FAFSA between Oct. 1 and March 15 at fafsa.gov

Use Point Park's school code 003357. Point Park's priority deadline for completing the FAFSA is March 15; the Pennsylvania State Grant deadline is May 1.

STEP

4

Review financial aid options.

Students receive an award letter from the University detailing the financial aid they are eligible to receive and the net cost to attend Point Park.



AID IS AWARDED ON MERIT AND/OR FINANCIAL NEED.



A STUDENT'S FINANCIAL AID PACKAGE CAN INCLUDE A VARIETY OF AID TYPES.

1

SCHOLARSHIPS

- This aid does not need to be repaid.
- Upon applying, students are automatically considered for merit scholarships based on academic and/or artistic achievement.

2

GRANTS

- This aid does not need to be repaid.
- It is awarded based on financial need once the FAFSA is submitted.

3

LOANS

- This aid must be repaid with interest.
- Payments on most student loans do not have to begin until after college.

4

WORK-STUDY PROGRAMS

- This aid does not need to be repaid; eligible students receive the funds on a monthly basis by working part time on campus.
- Eligibility is based on financial need once the FAFSA is submitted.

OTHER TUITION PAYMENT OPTIONS

- **Interest-Free, Monthly Payment Plans**
Pay the balance not covered by scholarships, grants and loans.
- **Employer Reimbursement**
Defer tuition payments for tuition being reimbursed by an employer.
- **Private Scholarships**

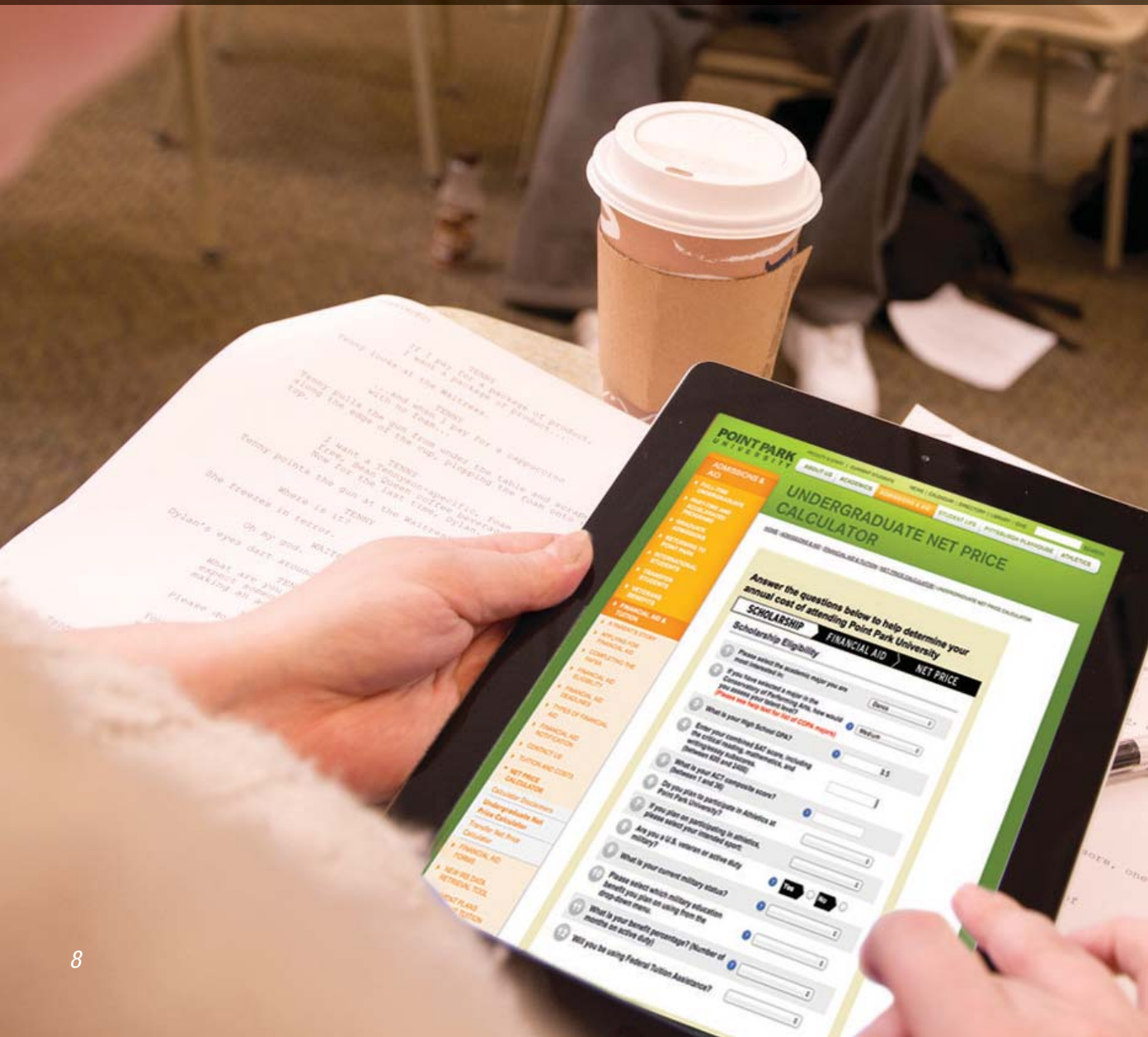

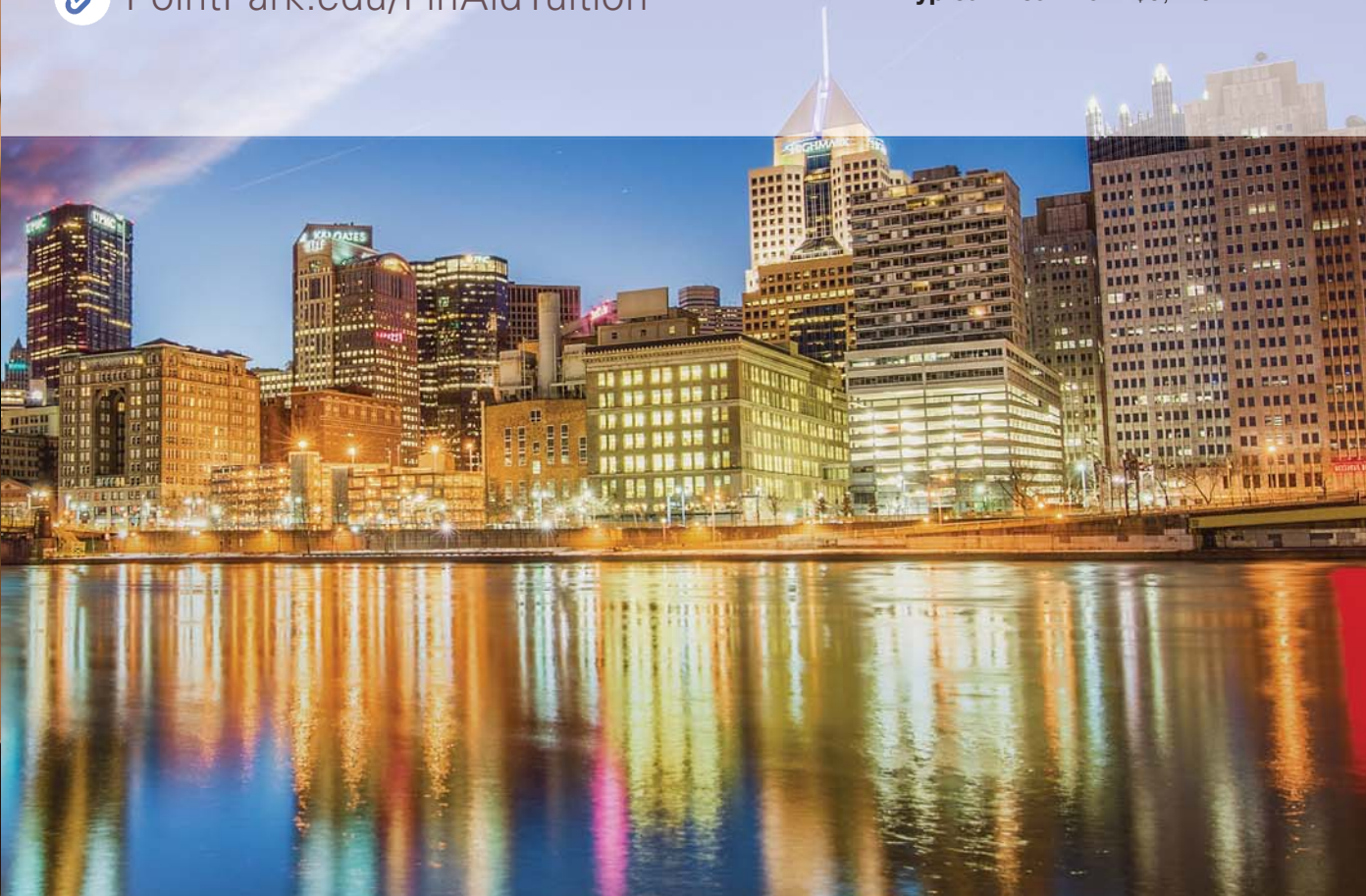
