Point Park Women's Basketball 2011-12 Preseason Storylines

The Pioneers have four starters returning for the third year in a row and will look to build on consecutive 14-13 seasons. Point Park has missed the playoffs the last two years by one game. The consecutive winning records mark the first time that happened in 25 years. Tony Grenek takes over as head coach for Sam Kosanovich. The Pioneers must replace All-AMC guard Ashley Henderson (17.3 ppg). Point guard April Austin (10.9 ppg) and Joncelyn Peterkin (10.5 ppg, 8.1 rpg) are top returning scorers. Kristen Beatty and Kristen Veseleny are also returning starters. Top newcomers are Division I transfer Emily Schartner and Katresa Savisky, latter of which scored 17.2 ppg on the junior college level.

TONY GRENEK, Head coach, 1st season at Point Park

Tony Grenek is in his first season as head coach of the Point Park University women's basketball team. He has 10 years of coaching experience on the college level with five years coming as a head coach. He comes to Point Park after spending the last five years as the top women's basketball assistant and associate head coach at NCAA Division II Seton Hill.

At Seton Hill, he was instrumental in the Griffins reaching the NCAA Division II national tournament in 2009-10, just their second season eligible for that event. Grenek's responsibilities for the Griffins included running a defense that ranked first in the West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference in opponent's points per game (60.0) last year. He made all the defensive calls for the Griffins and was responsible for much of the on-floor coaching. His duties included running practices, creating scouting reports and recruiting. Grenek employs a philosophy that is centered around playing tough defense, and his Point Park team will take on that strategy.

Grenek replaces Sam Kosanovich, who led Point Park to its most consistent success in decades the last five years. The Pioneers are coming off consecutive winning seasons for the first time in 25 years, but Kosanovich stepped down at the end of the 2010-11 season to become Point Park's Student Center Director full-time. He had been serving the role of women's basketball coach and Recreation Center Director for four years before taking over at the Student Center in his fifth season.

At Seton Hill, Grenek worked under well-known head coach Ferne Labati, who has had Grenek as her top assistant for all five years she's been at the school in Greensburg, Pa. Before coming to Seton Hill, Labati was the head coach for 17 years at NCAA Division I Miami (Fla.), and she has more than 500 career victories.

Grenek helped the Griffins to consecutive 20-win seasons the last two years. A break-through year was the 2009-10 season when Seton Hill went 23-8, reached the WVIAC tournament championship game, and qualified for the NCAA Division II national tournament.

Before going to Seton Hill, Grenek spent five years as the head men's basketball coach at Butler County Community College. He took over a program that had little interest and was 5-25 the year before his arrival. Grenek quickly turned things around there with an NJCAA Region 20 championship in his first season of 2001-02. The Pioneers made the Region 20 playoffs all five of his years, and the non-scholarship program was 35-19 the last two years under Grenek.

Highlights of Grenek's time at Butler County CC include being named the Western Pennsylvania Collegiate Conference Coach of the Year in 2004-05 and also coaching two junior college All-Americans.

Grenek earned a bachelor's degree in General Sociology from Indiana University of Pennsylvania in 1994 and a bachelor's degree in Elementary Education from Slippery Rock University in 1998.

APRIL AUSTIN

Guard, 5-6, Junior

Hometown: Penn Hills, Pa. High school: North Catholic

Previous school: Univ. of Dayton

All-AMC Second Team in 2009-10 & 2010-11

Profile: Austin is the Pioneers' point guard and an All-AMC Second Team selection the last two years. She is a former NCAA Division I recruit at Dayton who transferred to Point Park in 2009-10 and is in her third year in the program. She will be relied on to play a lot of minutes and lead the Point Park offense once again. She has the ability to shoot from the outside, drive to the basket, see the floor and set up her teammates. Austin holds the school single-season record for 3-pointers made with the 65 she made as a freshman. She has a chance to break the school career record for 3-pointers made this year.

2010-11: Austin was named All-AMC Second Team with 10.9 ppg and a team-high 89 assists. She started all 27 games and averaged 35.9 minutes per game. A pre-season foot injury dropped her production from her freshman year, but she was still among the top guards in the AMC. She had a season-high 25 points at Rio Grande and reached double figures in 14 of 27 games. She registered five or more assists eight times with a high of eight on two occasions.

2009-10: Austin was All-AMC Second Team with 14.7 ppg and team-best 98 assists. Her 65 3-pointers made set a Point Park single-season record. She finished second in the AMC Newcomer of the Year award race. Austin started all 27 games and led the Pioneers in scoring 11 times in her first season at Point Park. She scored in double figures 21 times, which included four 20-point games and one 30-point game. Her career high of 31 points, eight steals and six 3-pointers came at Geneva. The six treys at Geneva tied a school record, and her 65 3-pointers on the year broke the previous school record by seven.

Prior to Point Park: After an all-state career at North Catholic High School, she started her collegiate basketball career at NCAA Division I Dayton. She left the Flyers' program early in her freshman season, and she enrolled in the Univ. of Pittsburgh. Austin did not play basketball at Pitt, where she studied engineering for two years. **High school:** Austin was the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette's Class A Player of the Year as a senior in 2006-07. That year she was named to the PG's Class A Fab 5 team and the Tribune-Review Terrific 10. As a four-year starter, she scored 1,528 career points and was a first-team all-state selection as a senior. Austin led North Catholic to two WPIAL titles. In her senior year, she averaged 14.8 points, 5.4 assists, 4.3 rebounds and 4.2 steals per game in leading her team to the PIAA title game. **Personal:** Born Nov. 23, 1988...daughter of Damian and Sonja Austin...majoring in engineering.

KRISTEN BEATTY

Guard/Forward, 5-7, Senior

Hometown: Pittsburgh, Pa. High School: North Allegheny

Previous School: CCAC-Allegheny

Profile: Beatty is in her third year in the Point Park program but her second year as a full-time player. She is one of four returning starters and one of four seniors. She earned a starting job midway through last year when she was a reliable scorer at 6.4 ppg to go along with 3.7 rpg. Beatty is a hard-nosed swing player who is a strong driver of the basketball and also strong on defense. A slashing player, Beatty shot 43 percent from the field last year. She came to Point Park two years ago, but she had to sit out a year following two years at CCAC-Allegheny. After a 2010-11 season that was her first season of basketball in two years, she will look to progress her game with a strong senior year. **2010-11:** Beatty played in all 27 games with 15 starts. She started 15 of the last 18 games of the season. She led Point Park with a career-high 19 points in a win over Talladega (AL) in what was her second start of the year. Beatty scored double figures six times and had 13 points on four occasions. Her career-high nine rebounds came at Carlow, and her career-high six assists were at Ursuline. Beatty grabbed five steals vs. Houghton. **Prior to Point Park:** Beatty enjoyed a successful high school career at North Allegheny where she was a WPIAL all-star. She spent two years at CCAC-Allegheny. **Personal:** Daughter of Carol and John Beatty...born Sept. 23, 1988...majoring in human resource management.

ANNA-MARIA BOSHKOVA

Forward/Center, 6-1, Junior

Hometown: Sofia, Bulgaria High School: 22nd High School

Previous School: Fairmont State

Profile: Boshkova is in her second season at Point Park after spending her freshman year at NCAA Division II Fairmont State. The native of Sofia, Bulgaria, has a long and athletic build as a 6-1 forward. She showed a lot of potential in her first season with the Pioneers with averages of 3.7 ppg and 3.2 rpg as a reserve post player. In her third year of college basketball, Boshkova will look to further develop her game as an upperclassman. She came to college with a solid resume in international play as a member of the Bulgarian U-20 and U-19 national teams.

2010-11: Boshkova played in all 27 games and made seven starts. Primarily a reserve, Boshkova had 3.7 ppg and 3.2 rpg in 13.9 minutes per game. She shot 38 percent from the floor and 71 percent from the foul line. Her 14 blocks were second on the team to Jonelyn Peterkin. She had three double-digit games with a career-high 13 points coming vs. PSU-Fayette. She started the year with 11 points at Rio Grande and vs. Midway. She had a career-high nine rebounds and nine points vs. Salem International. **At Fairmont State:** Boshkova played in nine games as a backup in 2009-10. In 42 total minutes for the year, she scored 12 points on 5 of 8 shooting and pulled down 10 rebounds. A strong Fairmont State team was 22-10 last year, and Boshkova had several veteran post players in front of her in the lineup.

International: Boshkova was a member of the Bulgarian U-20 and U-18 teams in her native country of Bulgaria. A highlight of her international competition was averaging 5.5 points and 5.9 rebounds per game at the 2008 U-19 European Championship. During that event, she had career highs of 11 points vs. Ukraine and 13 rebounds vs. Belarus. **High school:** Boshkova averaged 18 points and 12 rebounds per game in the high school ranks. She was a team captain and MVP. **Personal:** Daughter of Georgi and Anna Boshkova...born Aug. 9, 1990.
