


A commercial photography concentration is also available



ANALOG VS. DIGITAL

At Point Park, there is no battle. You work in both analog and digital darkrooms.

- Black-and-white darkroom, up to mural-size printing
- Analog color darkroom, up to 24-inch printing, color film and paper processor
- Alternative processes lab including historical processes
- Film developing labs, up to 4-by-5 inches, in color and black-and-white
- Large mounting area with heat presses
- Digital editing suites with Mac Retina displays
- Scanning suites, including drum scanners
- Two studios, professional lighting for commercial, editorial and portrait photography
- Epson professional inkjet printers, up to 44-inch printing
- Full Adobe Creative Suite, accessed from any computer on campus
